






With the numerous traditions passed on to its people by the Spaniards, Americans and Japanese, the Philippines' way of celebrating Christmas, as it does with most of its holidays, is both festive and imaginative.

The Yuletide cheer can be discerned among Filipinos after the somber passage of November 1 or All Saints Day. Right after the annual commemoration of their dead, most Filipino families, as if in compensation, start to liven things up by decorating their homes with Christmas trees and multicolored lights. They hang lanterns to symbolize the forth-

But for many Filipinos, Christmas season starts when they start feeling the nip in the air brought by the northeastern monsoon. No Jack Frost for us there.

Yuletide, by custom and by tradition, officially starts on the 16th of December, the first of nine days set for the dawn mass or simbang-gabi, and culminates on the 24th or Christmas Eve.

A tradition that dates back to the 18th century, simbanggabi is one of the holiday rites sorely missed by Filipino expatriates, particularly those living in the Middle East.

After the mass, the faithful fill themselves with delicious Filipino delicacies puto-bumbong, bibingka, suman and other delights. Lately, common fares are being served by the stores that lined up the church patios, like lechong manok, barbecues, hot soups and pandesal.

Christmas On Filipinos hold the misa de aguinaldo. wherein faithful celebrate the birth of the Savior. The mass usually starts at eleven in the evening new. and ends at midnight.

After the mass, most families gather around the table to celebrate their noche buena, an occasion when all the members of the family and give gifts to each other.

noche buena are Filipino together on New Year's Day delicacies like quezo de bola, hamon, rice cakes and, with import liberalization, apples and grapes.

On the morning of the 25th or Christmas Day after the Christmas mass, children visit their godparents and receive their gifts. Understandably, they are all dressed nicely like

Simbang-gabi is held at their parents, as if for a town dawn and was originally fiesta. Christmas, after all, is the grandest of all fiestas in the Philippines.

Firecrackers and other cold December to attend the forms of pyrotechnic devices fill the stores and supermarket shelves; stalls selling all types of luces, hats and horns dominate the sidewalks.

New Year festivities start as early as ten in the evening of the last day of the year. One can hear the successive explosions and see the splendor of colorful fireworks lighting up the sky.

At exactly 12 midnight, the sights and sounds reach their culminating crescendo with pyrotechnic pinwheels and splinters of fires driving out the old year and ringing in the

From our Consulate, the staff and I wish you a merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year, and may it be a year of progress and good health to all of you.





Message

During Advent, we ask Jesus to come to us. But how will the power of God affect us when it enters our lives?

Many of us have a notion of God as judge, policing our every move and eager to pounce on us with punishment. That kind of thinking would make God seem very distant. When God seems far removed, we trick ourselves into mysterious strategies designed to leap this vast expense. We pray in a manner designed to bind God's ear: make that raise come about, bring that new home into reality, or help a romance to blossom. Our willful spirit

wants mastery over the mystery of God.

Our thirst for control wants personal power to exceed divine power. We overlook the ease with which we could let the benevolent will of God work on our behalf.

But the power of God is not the power of human success; sometimes it's the exact opposite. The Hebrew people expected the Messiah to be a great political leader who would crush the Roman persecution. Yet, Rome remained in charge, holding the people hostage.

The same scenario is played out today. Nations and people look for a ruler who will bring miraculous change. New leaders surface and then fall victim to greed and the abuse of power - they are anything but divine. Justice, peace and mercy become lost values up against the allure of fame and wealth.

Jesus was not the expected hero. He Entered without fanfare. The message was forgiveness and love, not violence and conquest. Rather than calling people to war, the Father called the people to Himself. Power was experienced as intimacy with

God. Love would be the force capable of melting the hard hearts of tyrannical rulers and devouring empires. Surrender to God and alliances with His Kingdom would prove the road to glory.

This is not a forbidding or threatening God. Our God invites us to come to Him, to approach without fear. God wants us to be close. Just open your heart and let Him come in.


We observe this day each year as an expression of thanksgiving on our part for the good year to end, and hope and pray that the new one to come be happier and more prosperous.
