



I congratulate you on your Independence Day and wish you, your families and your friends all the best in the future.



I. Benedean - Igorot Dance

Wigan, the hunter god of the Ifugaos, was given rich valleys and insurmountable canyons for hunting by the god of gods, Muntalug. Wigan found the first rice stalk. He planted the grains and cultivated it, and it yielded a bountiful harvest. He fermented his harvest and offered wine to the gods above him and also to those beneath him. Muntalug was pleased and gave him staple rice. He called Wigan, Ifugao, the first eater of *ipugo* or rice. Benedean is the Ifugao's thanksgiving dance for the harvest.

2. Scenes from the Sinulog

The feast of the Sto. Niño (Infant Jesus) is celebrated with frenzied and frolic fiestas, erupting into noctumal processions and street revelry, a la New Orleans Mardi Gras. The most popular ones are: Ati-Atihan of Aklan with a re-enaction of the peace pact and sale of Panay Island to the Bornean datus; the Dinadyang of Iloilo, an off-shoot of Ati-Atihan; and the Sinulog of Cebu with a replay of Rajah Humambon and Humanai's (Queen Juana) baptism with Pigafetta, the Spanish historian, giving the baptismal gift - the image of the Christ Child dressed in pricely garbs. It was this very image which intrigued the native queen which won the day for the conquistadores, not the cannons nor the cross nor the

promise of friendship with the Spanish King. The icon was lost 44 years later and it was found by Lopez de Legazpi, the Spanish Colonizer.

The FAD Folkloric Group shows an epitome of the Sinulog with dance to the Holy Cross, *Subli* and *linanbay* or *moro-moro* dance.

3. Magdaragat

With the coastal waters surrounding the more than 7,000 islands of the Philippines, fishing is a major industry. Drying fish, fixing nets, rafts or boats are peppered with singing and dancing, mimicking the movements of fishes and shell animals of the sea as in the dance Filemon. In Patinihan, a lass is being courted by swains with lamparas (oil lamps) in a bright moonlight. During the festival of Our Lady of Manaoag of Pangasinan and Our Lady of Peñafrancia of Naga, young ladies dance with paddles gaily decorated with flowers honoring the blessed icons as shown in the dance, Sagwanan. The Philippines' most famous dance was named after the bird tikling which lives in the rice paddies. The tinikling clearly illustrates the character of the Filipinos of juggling their daily lives between poverty and calamities, as symbolized by clapping bamboo pools.


